"New Zealand Stamps" by Campbell Paterson

Of all the Pictorials we have dealt with, this is probably the simplest of all to separate its printings. Only four variations are to be found and all are easily recognisable. Presuming, as usual that we have a number of stamps to identify, those with a single watermark should be first removed. These may most easily be recognised by their vertical mesh. Stamps with horizontal mesh which remain will all be on multiple watermarked paper. From these take out any perforations of $12 \frac{1}{2}$. Separate all which is left which will be $14 \times 13 \frac{1}{2}$, into fine paper and coarse paper. The latter has a newspaper like quality and was used for the final printing made in the war years.
