- The paper of L7e is noticeably poor in quality - similar to newsprint in appearance. It is thus readily recognized as not being L7c which is on fine white paper.
- Plate No. 1 above (in both block of 4 and strip of 20) represents a re-use of the original unnumbered centre plate (last used in combination with frame plate Nos.-2A, -2B in 1936; see L7b).
- Between the two periods of its use many impressions were re-entered
